- Confirmation of scores from the latest Healthcare Commission Review: RBWM DAAT scored 4 = excellent
- Toby Mallowan was amongst 50 workers invited to the House of Lords to be thanked for his contribution to the DIP service in the Borough
- Retention is 92% exceeding the target of 83%
- Planned exits 66% exceeding the target of 50%
- 8 PQQs returned for the tender of T2
- Marked increase in criminal justice clients
