The application is also for variation of the conditions by changing the retail sales area in accordance with the attached plan and by adding the following:

1. All staff must successfully pass the Store Alcohol Training Course before being able to sell alcohol. Written training records will be made available for inspection by authorised officers upon reasonable request
2. All staff must demonstrate to the Designated Supervisor that they can communicate in English before being allowed to sell alcohol
3. Two staff will be on duty from 19:00 until 23:00 (or store closing) Friday and Saturday

### **C) OBSERVATIONS**

The Sub Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives which are:

- The prevention of crime and disorder;
- Public safety;
- The prevention of public nuisance;
- The protection of children from harm

In making its decision, the Committee is also obliged to have regard to national guidance and the Council's own Licensing Policy.

Of course, the Committee must have regard to all of the representations made and the evidence it hears.

The Committee must take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:

- a) grant the application as requested
- b) modify the conditions of the licence, by altering or omitting or adding to them
- c) Reject the whole or part of the application

The previous Licence for the premises was revoked by Members following an application for a Review by Thames Valley Police.
