

Windsor Neighbourhood Plan Referendum

Information Statement

A referendum relating to the adoption of the Windsor Neighbourhood Plan will be held.

The referendum will be held on **Thursday 6 May 2021**.

The question which will be asked in the referendum is:

“Do you want the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Windsor to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?”

The referendum area is identical to the area which has been designated as the Windsor neighbourhood area. The Windsor neighbourhood area encompasses most residential properties in Windsor excluding the town centre and comprises the whole of Clewer East and Clewer and Dedworth East wards and partial areas of Clewer and Dedworth West, Eton and Caste and Old Windsor wards.

The referendum area is identified on the map which is included with this information statement.

A person is entitled to vote in the referendum if, on **Monday 19 April 2021**, they are registered as a local government elector within the referendum area and he or she is eighteen years of age or over on the date of the referendum.

The referendum expenses limit that will apply in relation to the referendum is **£3,664.61**. The number of persons entitled to vote in the referendum by reference to which the limit has been calculated is 22,078.

The referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures which are similar to those used at local government elections.



- Statement that sets out general information as to town and country planning (including neighbourhood planning) and the referendum, which is prepared having regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State.
